

**Top 10 “must-sees”** : 10 reasons to come and stay in Paris for this once-in-a-lifetime experience!

1. **Welcome the Flame to the city:** On July 14, 15, and 26, [after nearly two months of journeying across France](#), the Flame will arrive in Paris. Join us for an unforgettable celebration. Come and celebrate the pioneers—community leaders, partners, influencers, athletes, and volunteers—who bring our neighbourhoods to life every day!
2. **Try out new sports, finally!** Make 2024 the year you finally keep that New Year's resolution. From July 14 to September 8, join Parisians on [the forecourt of the Hôtel de Ville, la “Terrasse des Jeux”](#) for an exciting lineup of activities held by the city's most creative organisations. Enjoy redesigned sports fields and daily surprises. Plus, you won't miss one moment of the big events—two giant screens will allow you to cheer for your favourite athletes !
3. **Capture a family picture with the Olympic Cauldron and Rings:** Who will be the legendary final torchbearer to inaugurate the Games' unique site that will house the Olympic cauldron and rings? Join us on July 26, 2023, to find out ...
4. **Discover the vibrancy of Paris' neighbourhoods with the [24 live sites, the “Clubs 2024”](#)**, animating the city to the rhythm of the Games, from Place Saint-Sulpice (6th arrondissement) to Jardin d'Eole (19th arrondissement), passing through *La Grange aux Belles* (10th arrondissement) or the iconic *Arènes de Lutèce* (5th arrondissement).
5. **Meet the athletes:** A champion's "Walk of Fame" at Trocadéro? That's the bold idea set to immerse everyone, free of charge and without tickets, in the Games' spirit : offer medallists and the public an emotionally charged experience, right in front of the Eiffel Tower, at the **Champions Park**! Join us every day at 5:30 PM for a unique crowd experience. And from 7:30 PM, catch the day's major sporting events live on the site's giant screens until 11:30 PM.
6. **Experience unique artistic performances at Champions Park:** Every day at 5:30 PM (3 PM on August 9 and 10), discover "Défilé" by Angelin Preljocaj, a renowned figure in contemporary dance, featuring 40 dancers from his company ; as well as the "Olympic Games Ball," the first voguing ball in Olympic history, in collaboration with the Gaité Lyrique ; and a hip hop parade by Mourad Merzouki, a major name in French hip hop choreography, with 30 dancers. These brief yet spectacular shows, lasting about fifteen minutes each, are designed to unleash collective energy and celebrate the medal-winning athletes.
7. **Celebrate Team France at La Villette:** whether it be by the giant outdoor screen every day until 11 PM, or immersed in the excitement at [Club France](#), share your passion with 900 French athletes during festivities and experience over 300 hours of live event broadcasts together!

8. **Travel through the Nations Park:** Canada, Brazil, India, Mexico, and a dozen other delegations will offer daily surprises in La Villette Park. Take an architectural stroll to discover some of the pavilions designed and built by students from national architecture schools (Archi-Folies 2024).
9. **(Re)visit iconic locations:** "Olympism, a modern invention, an ancient legacy" at the Louvre Museum, "The Olympic medal" at La Monnaie de Paris, "Olympism, another History of the World" at the National Museum of the History of Immigration, a cycloidal ramp at the Pompidou Center, and the exhibition "Imprints - 1924-2024, one hundred years of Olympic legacy" on the fences of the Tuileries Garden.
10. **Take a leisurely walk along the Saint-Denis canal,** where you'll find a vibrant mix of sports, art, and cultural activities amid urban games and celebrations from Plaine Commune to the Stade de France and Paris. A village of activities focused on sustainable development punctuates the journey.
